






CODES OF CONDUCT - SENIOR FOOTBALL

Senior Coach:

1. Respect all individuals within the context of my involvement in Australian football, and will refrain from any discriminatory practices including, but not limited to, discrimination on the basis of race, religion, gender, ethnic background, special ability/disability or sexual orientation, preference or identity.
2. Abide by and teach the AFL Laws of the Game and the Rules of my Club and League/Association.
3. Be reasonable in the demands I make on the time commitments of the players in my care, having consideration for their health and well-being.
4. Be supportive at all times and I will refrain from any form of personal or physical abuse and unnecessary physical contact with the players in my care.
5. Show consideration for varying maturity and levels of ability of my players when designing practice schedules, practice activities and involvement in football competition.
6. Where responsible for players in the 5-18 year old age group, use best endeavours to ensure that players gain equal playing time.
7. Monitor and ensure the safety of players in my care.
8. In recognising injury and sickness, seek and follow the physician's advice concerning the participation and / or return to training of injured or ill players.
9. Keep up to date with the principles of coaching and skill development, and of factors relating to the welfare of my players.
10. At all times display and teach appropriate sporting behaviour, ensuring that players understand and practice fair play.
11. Display and foster respect for umpires, opponents, coaches, administrators, officials, parents and spectators.
12. Ensure that players are involved in a positive environment where skill learning and development are priorities and are not overshadowed by a desire to win.
13. Reject the use of performance enhancing substances in sport and will abide by the guidelines in the AFL Anti-Doping policy.
14. Acknowledge that the AFL, or a body affiliated with the AFL, may take disciplinary action against me if I breach any part of this Code of Conduct. I understand that the AFL, or a body affiliated with the AFL, is required to implement a complaints handling procedure in accordance with the principles of natural justice, in the event of an allegation against me.
15. Acknowledge that disciplinary action against me may include de-registration as a Coach and a member of CoachAFL.
16. Read, understood and agree to be bound by the Terms and Conditions of Accreditation as a coach and member of CoachAFL.

Senior Umpires:

1. Place the safety and welfare of the participants above all else.
2. Be familiar with the *Laws of Australian Football* and the rules and conditions of your League.
3. Regularly attend training, coaching sessions, social and League activities in a bid to improve your umpiring.
4. Be aware of the need to recruit more umpires and speak enthusiastically about umpiring to encourage others to become involved in umpiring.
5. Be a positive role model in behaviour and appearance.
6. Promote the umpiring fraternity and present yourself in a friendly and professional manner before, during and after games.
7. Avoid any situation that may lead to a conflict of interest.
8. Support activities designed to encourage participation of people in umpiring and football in general.
9. Never swear, use abusive, derogatory or vilifying language during the game or when addressing the players, other umpires or officials.
10. Understand the leadership role that an umpire plays in controlling the game day environments on match day and the behaviour of players, officials and supporters.
11. Avoid verbal and physical confrontation with players, officials and spectators at all times.

Senior Players:

1. Be familiar with the *Laws of Australian Football* and abide by the rules and conditions of your League/Club.
2. Avoid verbal and physical confrontation with players, officials and umpires at all times. Under no circumstances should you engage in physical violence on the field of play.
3. Never swear, use abusive, derogatory or vilifying language during the game or when addressing other players, umpires or officials. Be mindful of the presence of young people, females and spectators.
4. Support activities designed to encourage participation of young players at junior clubs, schools and development programs.
5. Ensure that both on and off the field behaviour is consistent with the principles of good sportsmanship.
6. Do not abuse, dispute or react in an obviously provocative or disappointed manner towards an umpire.
7. Conduct yourself at a high level of personal behaviour on and off the field in such a manner so as not to bring the Club or the game of Australian Football into disrepute. Negative or disparaging comments on social media must not be used.
8. Be aware of the differing needs and attitudes of players at your Club.
9. Under no circumstances should you play in a match under the influence of alcohol.
10. Under no circumstances should you play in a match under the influence of recreational or banned performance enhancing drugs.

Runners/Water Carriers:

1. The sole duty of the runner shall be to confer with the player or players of his/her Club and to immediately leave the playing arena.
2. Must be an adult.
3. Must not be under suspension from the League
4. Must be clearly identified.
5. The runners name must be entered on the team sheet.
6. Runners should not engage in abusive or insulting language directed at opposition players.
7. Runners must never dispute an umpire's decision.
8. Not to be involved in melees or man-handle players in any way.

League/Club Officials:

1. Value the involvement of umpires and officials in the game. Without them matches wouldn't be possible.
2. Never swear, use abusive, derogatory or vilifying language when addressing players, umpires or officials. Be mindful of the presence of young people, females and other spectators.
3. Do not abuse, dispute or react in an obviously provocative or disappointed manner towards an umpire.
4. Avoid verbal and physical confrontation with players, officials, umpires and other spectators at all times. Under no circumstances should you engage in physical violence.
5. Value the importance of other volunteers. They give of their time and resources to provide recreational activities for the community.
6. Drink responsibly and discourage binge drinking. WACFL venues are bound by the State's Liquor Licencing Laws.
7. Under no circumstances should you attend a WACFL match under the influence of recreational drugs.
8. Support other League and Club officials in maintaining the highest standard of behaviour both on and off the field for the betterment of the League.

Gate Takings:

- Gate fees will commence at the **beginning** of the junior game before the senior match and will **end** at half time of the League game.
- Finals gate takings will commence at the **beginning** of the day, before the first junior game and will **end** at half time of the league.
- There are to be no Dogs allowed in the venue at trainings or games.
- Strictly no alcohol is to be brought into the venue. Patrons consuming alcohol outside of license areas is not permitted.
- Drunken, disorderly or abusive conduct will not be tolerated.

JUNIORS CODE OF CONDUCT

Coaches Code of Conduct

1. SPIRIT OF JUNIOR FOOTBALL

1a ALL coaches must understand and adhere to BYLAW #1 'The Spirit of Junior Football'.

2. #HAVEFUN

2a Ensure that players are involved in a positive environment where skill learning and development are priorities and are not overshadowed by a desire to win.

3. #BESAFE

3a Be always supportive and refrain from any form of personal abuse or unnecessary physical contact with the players in your care.

3b Stress and monitor safety always.

3c In recognising the significance of injury and sickness, you will seek and follow the physician's advice concerning the return of injured, concussed, or ill players to training.

3d Keep informed regarding sound principles of coaching and skill development, and of factors relating to the welfare of your players.

4. #BEHEALTHLY

4a Be reasonable in the demands you make on the time commitments of the players in your care, having due consideration for their health and well-being.

4b Have due consideration for varying maturity and ability levels of your players when designing practice schedule, practice activities and involvement in competition.

5. #PLAYFAIR

5a Abide by and teach the AFL Laws of the Game and the Rules of your Club, District and League/Association.

5b Display and always teach appropriate sporting behaviour, ensuring that players understand and practise fair play.

5c Reject the use of performance enhancing substances in sport and abide by the guidelines set forth in the AFL Drug Policy.

6. #SHOWRESPECT

6a Display and foster respect for umpires, opponents, coaches, administrators, other officials, parents, and spectators.

7. #INCLUDEALL

7a Respect the rights, dignity and worth of all individuals within the context of your involvement in Australian Football, including refraining from any discriminatory practices based on race, religion, ethnic background, or special ability/disability.

7b **Avoid overplaying the talented players aiming to maximise participation and enjoyment for all players regardless of ability.**

When responsible for players in the 5-18-year-old age group, strive to ensure that all players gain equal playing time.

Runners Code of Conduct

1. SPIRIT OF JUNIOR FOOTBALL

1a ALL runners must understand and adhere to BYLAW #1 'The Spirit of Junior Football'.

2. #BESAFE

2a The runner must be clearly identified.

2b The runner's name must be entered on team sheets.

3. #GIVEBACK

3a The runner should be an adult.

4. #SHOWRESPECT

4a No abusive language or swearing.

4b Always support the decision of the umpires and never question decisions.

4c Deliver message and leave the ground immediately. Your role is not to coach or direct players. Do not remain on the ground. The game is for the kids, not you.

5. WATER CARRIERS

5a Water carriers are not permitted in Junior Community Football in Western Australia unless explicitly permitted by WAFC Community Football staff in circumstances of extreme heat.

5b If WAFC staff permit water carriers, items 1a to 4b are applicable and as per 4c, water carriers must deliver water then immediately leave the ground. The water carriers shall be identified with a fluorescent vest or appropriate shirt that is approved by the umpires prior to the game starting and must have their names included on the team sheets.

Spectators and Parents Code of Conduct

1. SPIRIT OF JUNIOR FOOTBALL

1a ALL parents and spectators must understand and adhere to BYLAW #1 'The Spirit of Junior Football'.

2. #HAVEFUN

2a Encourage children to participate in sport and have fun. Although remember this is about their ambition, and not yours.

2b Remember that children play organised sports for fun. They are not playing for the entertainment of spectators, nor are they mini adults. Let them have fun and enjoy their junior sport experience.

3. #GIVEBACK

3a Recognise the value and importance of volunteer coaches, managers and helpers. Put your hand up to volunteer yourself.

4. #BEHEALTHY

4a Encourage your child to play multiple sports – they do not need to specialise and play one sport all year round.

5. #PLAYFAIR

5a Encourage children to always participate according to the rules.

5b Encourage players to follow the rules and the umpire's decisions.

6. #SHOWRESPECT

6a Never ridicule or yell at a child for making a mistake or losing a game.

6b Remember that children learn best from example. Applaud good plays by both teams.

6c If you disagree with an official, raise the issue through the appropriate channels rather than questioning the official's judgment and honesty in public.

6d Support all efforts to remove verbal and physical abuse from sporting activities.

6e Condemn the use of violence in any form, be it by spectators, coaches, officials or players.

6f Demonstrate appropriate social behaviour by not swearing, using derogatory language, harassing players, coaches, umpires or volunteers.

Players Code of Conduct

1. SPIRIT OF JUNIOR FOOTBALL

1a ALL players must understand and adhere to BYLAW #1 'The Spirit of Junior Football'.

2. #HAVEFUN

2a Play for the "fun of it" and not just to please parents and coaches.

3. #PLAYFAIR

3a Play by the rules.

3b Be a good sport. Applaud all good plays whether they are by your team, opponent, or the other team.

3c Be prepared to take responsibility for your actions.

4. #BRINGYOURBEST

4a Work equally hard for yourself and for your team. Your team's performance will benefit so will you.

5. #SHOWRESPECT

5a Never argue with an umpire or an official. If you disagree, discuss the matter with your coach or teacher after the game.

5b Control your temper. Verbal abuse of officials or other players, or provoking an opponent is not acceptable.

5c Treat all players as you would like to be treated. Do not interfere with, bully, or take unfair advantage of another teammate or player.

5d Avoid using derogatory language or swearing.

6. #INCLUDEALL

6a Cooperate with and support your coach, teammates, and opponents. Without them there would no competition.






